About UCU

University College Utrecht has a Liberal Arts and Sciences model, consisting of 20+ disciplines. UCU offers around 230 courses annually. Every student at UCU has a personalized and unique curriculum crafted along with your “tutor”. UCU also has 43 committees and teams that organize campus events, parties, international trips, prom, musical show, fashion show, and more!

Why Choose UCU

University College Utrecht has a different set-up than most universities because of its small-scale environment and residential campus. At UCU, students and professors have close interactions due to small class sizes. There are many committees on campus which creates a strong community and makes UCU a social and engaging place to study and live. Utrecht itself is also a beautiful city, with its Oudegracht canal and lively atmosphere, and is home to the famous icon Miffy (Nijntje). It is a centrally located city in the Netherlands, making it easy to explore and travel. Utrecht is a very biking-friendly city, and even has the largest bicycle parking facility in the world!

*Orientation week ("Introweek") starts one week prior to the start of the semester. Participation is obligatory for exchange students.

Catch up exams will take place after the end of the semester. This date is 23 December 2026 for Fall 2026 students, and 19 May 2027 for Spring 2027 students.

Introweek

This is the orientation week at UCU, it runs from 19 January until 24 January 2027. It is the week before the start of the semester. Participation for exchange students is **mandatory** and aims to facilitate settling into campus life.

Students are divided into "families", and exchange students will be mixed with degree students. Introweek activities include practical matters but also fun events organized by the "parents" of each family.



There are also some infosessions by the Student Association (UCSA) and events (such as Sports Day!) planned for all students to attend. The first week is also there to deal with practical matters such as: registering in the city, registering for insurances, registering for a general practitioner, starting a phone plan, activating Solis ID/Osiris/BrightSpace, buying a bike, buying a public transport card, order textbooks, and more.

Housing and Meals

All students at UCU, including incoming exchange students, have the right to on-campus housing on the UCU campus. Students live in "units" of 6 to 12 people of mixed nationalities and genders with which they share a living room, toilets and a kitchen. Utilities (water and electricity), WiFi, access to campus facilities, and UCSA membership are included in the campus fee.

As for personal rooms, each room is furnished with a bed, desk, chair, and closet. Students can express a preference for a single (individual) or double (shared with one other person) room. Accommodation of this preference is subject to demand and can vary from year to year. The move-out date can be found in the academic calendar.

As for meals, all units at UCU are equipped with kitchens that include a stove, a freezer, an oven and a fridge. UCU does not offer a meal plan so students are expected to cook their own meals, but there is a Dining Hall on campus where students can purchase meals.

Getting Around

Public Transportation and Biking

To use public transportation in the Netherlands, most people use an OV-chipkaart which is a personal travel card that can be used nationwide on trains, busses, trams, and metros. However, payment via debit or credit card is also possible. Within Utrecht, the biking culture is very strong, and biking is one of the main modes of transport in the city. Buying a secondhand bike or renting a Swapfiets is common.
